<i>Description:</i>	St. Andrew's College is one of the three 19th century colleges affiliated with the University of Sydney. Its main building is a very large Victorian sandstone edifice built in 1876. This new building aims to follow the tradition of good quality sympathetic architectural design as found in previous additions by Sulman, Power and Adam, Power & Nixon, Emil Sodersten, Leslie Wilkinson and Ellice Nosworthy. It accommodates 35 new student bedrooms with ensuite bathrooms to meet the growing demand for placements at the newly coeducational College. Positioned hard on the boundary of Carillon Avenue, it provides a link between the main building and the previously isolated Thyne Wing. It completes an eastern courtyard and provides a new entrance to the College which brings about a more cohesive college building group.
